The 1954-1955 Council was blessed with interested, capable and dynamic leaders who, through their unselfish efforts, have made the Council one of the most progressive in the history of the College.

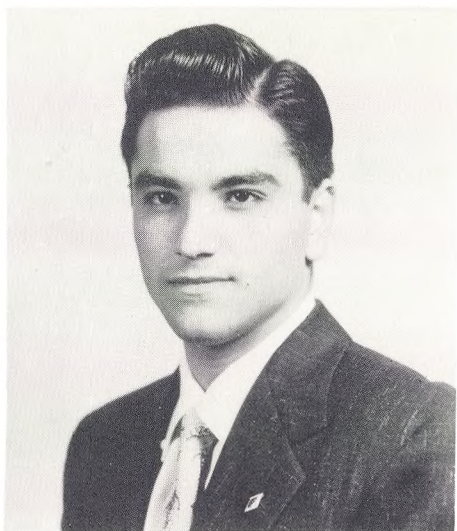
To begin with, the celebration of the Marian year at St. Francis reached its apex when a public Mass—to which the Newman Clubs of the Various secular

Truly, in preserving the best in the St. Francis tradition, and in stressing progress, the Council has earned the respect of all at St. Francis.



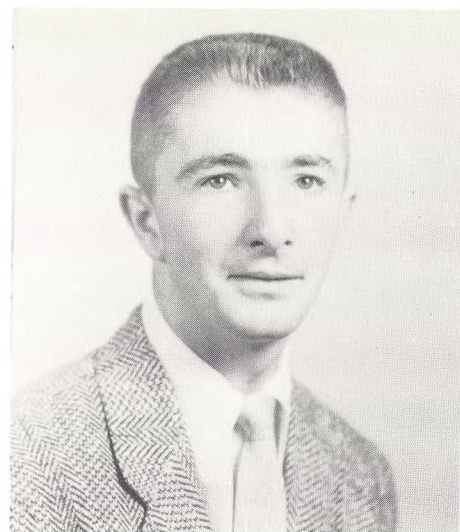
