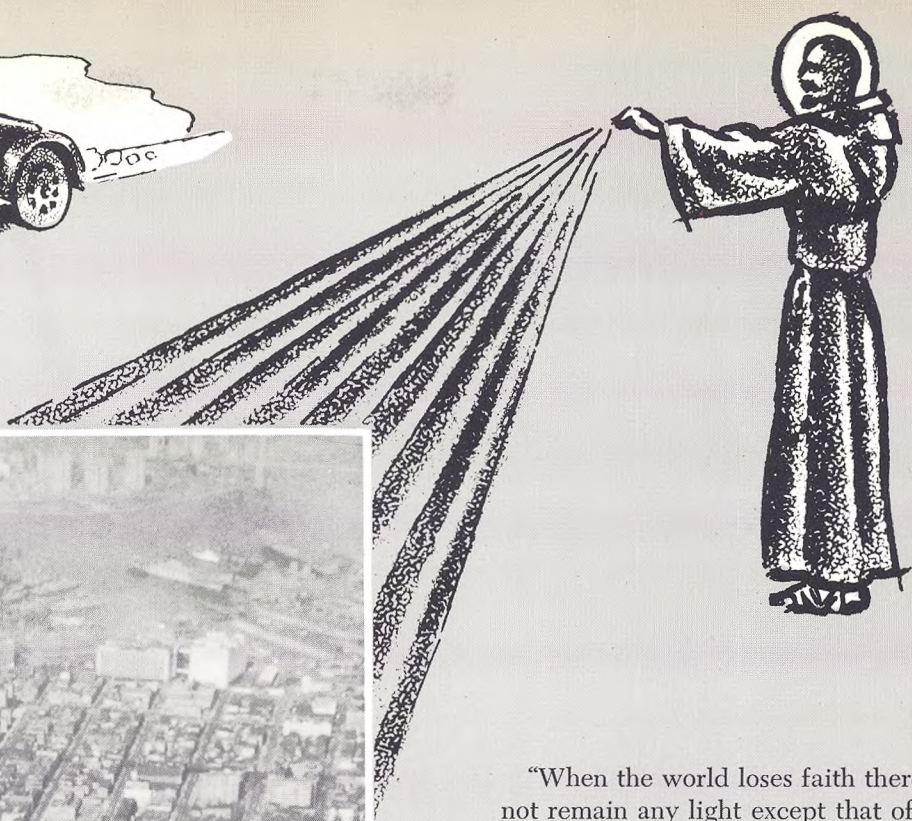
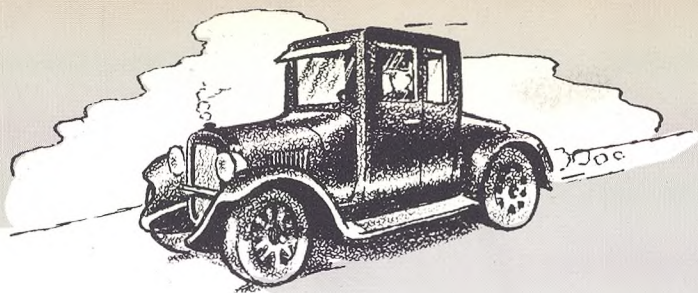
Dedication

WE DEDICATE the Saint Francis College Annual to the Franciscan Brothers of Brooklyn on the occasion of their Centennial Anniversary.

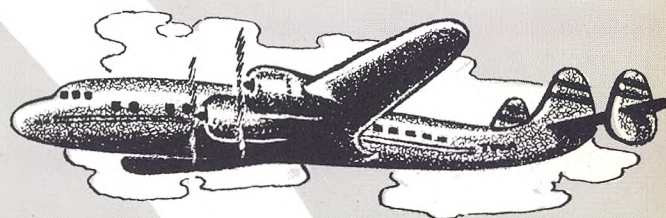

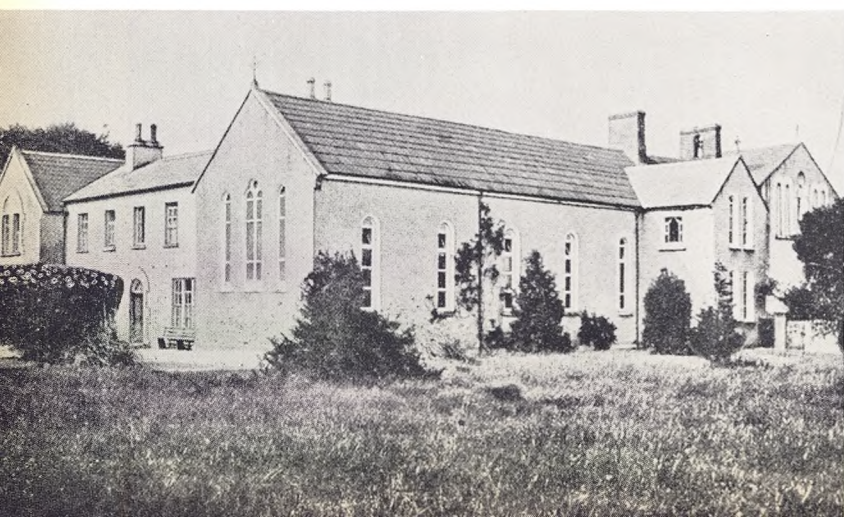

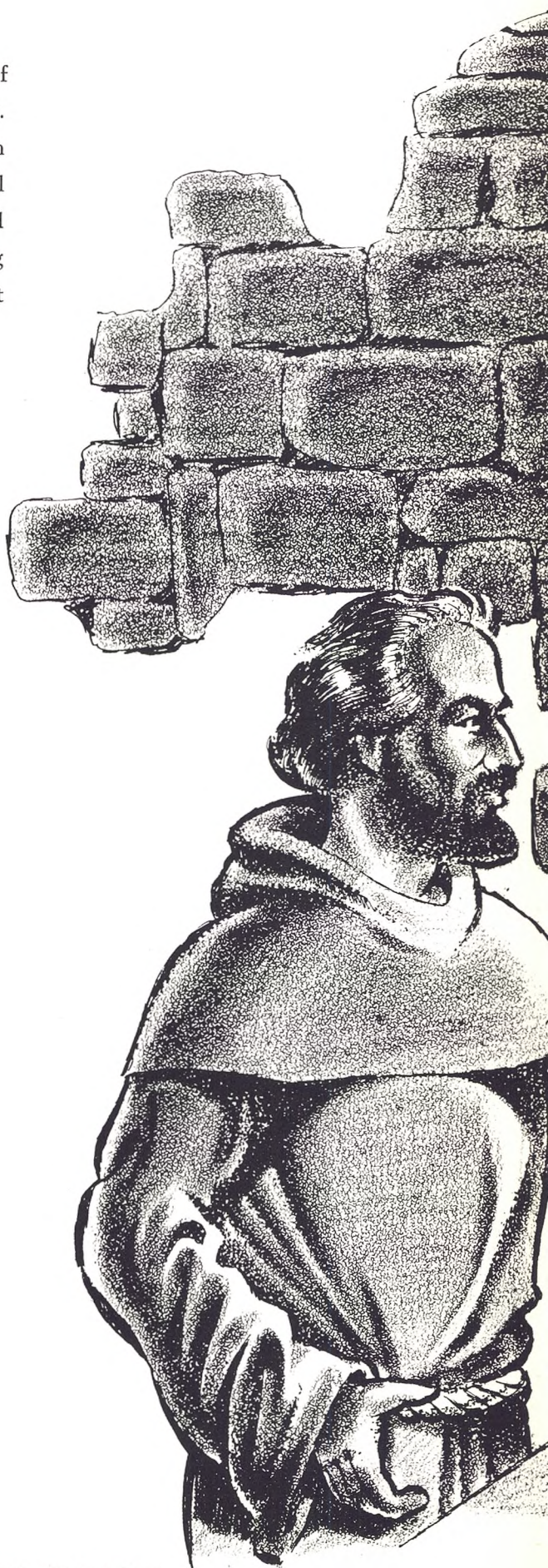


BISHOP LOUGHLIN

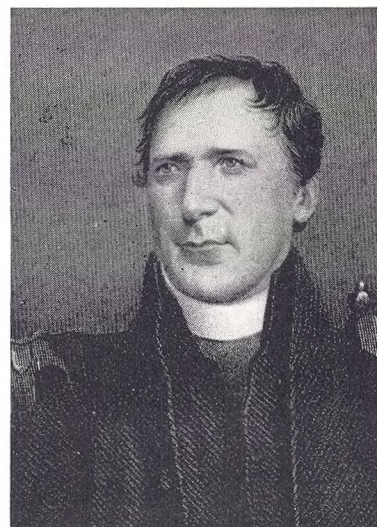
RIGHT REVEREND JOHN LOUGHLIN, D.D., upon being consecrated the first Bishop of Brooklyn, assumed the task of establishing a parish school system. He requested aid from the Irish Congregation of Franciscan Brothers. Two Franciscans, Brother John McMahon and Brother Vincent Hayes, arrived from Galway on May 31, 1858, to begin the new American foundation.



MOUNT BELLEW in Ireland from which the first Franciscan Brothers came to Brooklyn.

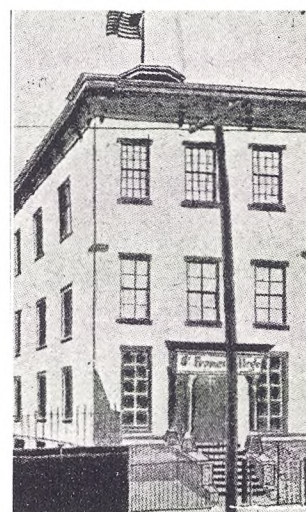

IN THE FALL OF 1859 the two Brothers, with the help of a layman, Martin St. Ledger, converted the building into a combination monastery and school, with living quarters for the Brothers established in the basement. Thus, Saint Francis Academy, the first private secondary school in the Diocese of Brooklyn, from which St. Francis College developed, was opened with a faculty of two Brothers and three laymen. In December of the same year, at their own request, the Franciscans were placed "pro tempore" under the jurisdiction of the Bishop of Brooklyn. Shortly thereafter, the Franciscans purchased property on Butler Street and founded Brooklyn's first Franciscan Novitiate.

THE YEAR 1868 saw the Brooklyn congregation of the Regular Order of Saint Francis receive legal status under the title, "The Saint Francis Monastery of the City of Brooklyn," as granted by the Legislature of the State of New York.

ON MAY 8, 1884, the New York State Legislature empowered the trustees to "establish a literary college in the City of Brooklyn under the title of St. Francis College, with the same power to confer diplomas and literary honors and degrees as is possessed by Universities and Colleges of this State." The first Bachelor of Arts Degree was conferred in June, 1885; seven years later, the first Bachelor of Science degree was granted.

THE ST. FRANCIS' MONASTERY
 of the City of Brooklyn

Passed May 8th, 1884, three-fifths being present.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section I. Section one of chapter eight hundred and fifty-one of the laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-eight is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section I. John Loughlin, D.D., Robert Magner, Joseph Hill, James Carrier and Patrick Garvey and their associates and successors shall be, and they are hereby constituted a body corporate and politic, and by that name shall have perpetual succession, and may sue and be sued in any Court of competent jurisdiction, make and use a corporate seal and alter the same at pleasure, and may take, receive, hold and enjoy by gift, grant, devise, bequest or otherwise, any real estate or personal property not exceeding Two Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars, but any devise or bequest thereto in trust or otherwise by any person having a husband, wife, child or parent, of more than one half of his or her estate after payment of his or her debts shall be valid only to the extent of said one half of said estate, and no devise or bequest thereto shall be valid in any other case.

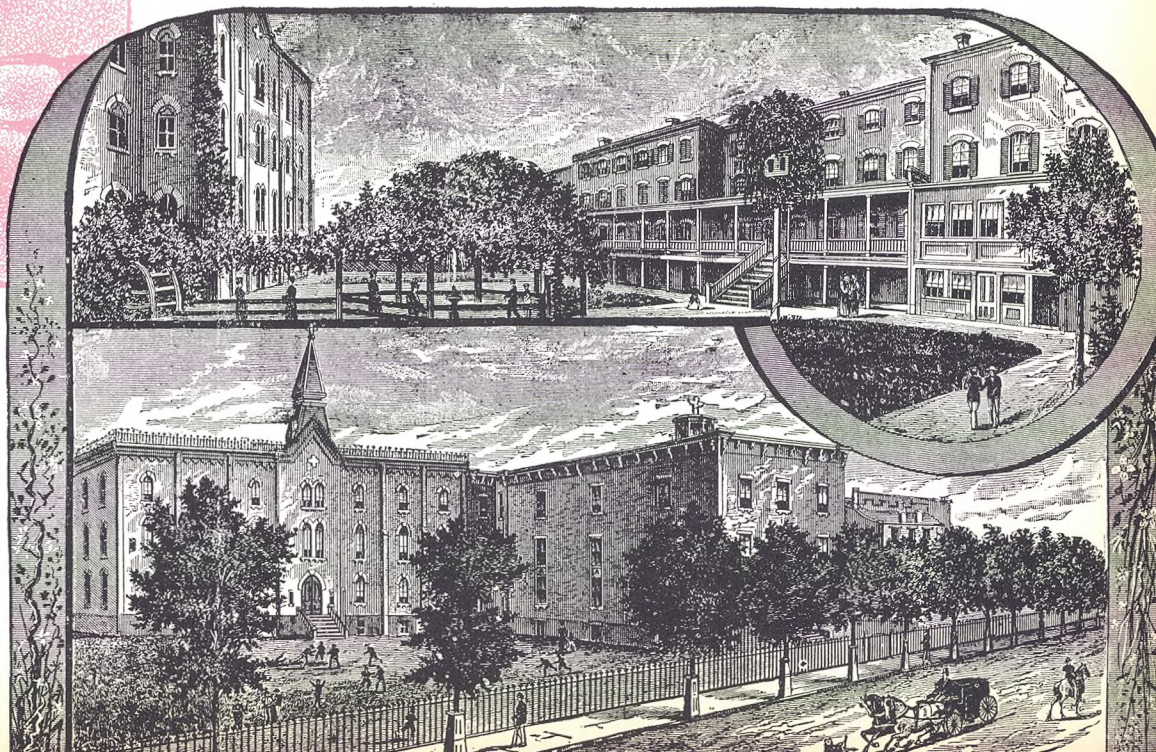

MEDIAEVAL MONKS IN MODERN DAYS.

How the Sons of St. Francis Live and Teach.

During the first week of the present month of October a chapter of the American Province of the Franciscan Order of Minor Conventuals was held at Syracuse, N. Y., at which the Most Rev. Bonaventura Soldatch, of Rome, Italy, was present to direct and preside. With one exception he is the only General of the order who has ever visited America, the purpose of his trip being to examine the condition of the cloisters in the American Province, with the view of improving them. Delegates were present from the various cloisters in America, and the Province was divided into an eastern and western "Custos." Rev. Clemens Luitz, of Utica, N. Y., was made Guardian of the East, and the Rev. Vincenz Duimorich, of Louisiana, Guardian of the West. The Rev. Miller, of Louisville, Ky., was appointed Custos of the Latin term for the head of a convent of Franciscan monks.

the amassing of 108 points in one game.

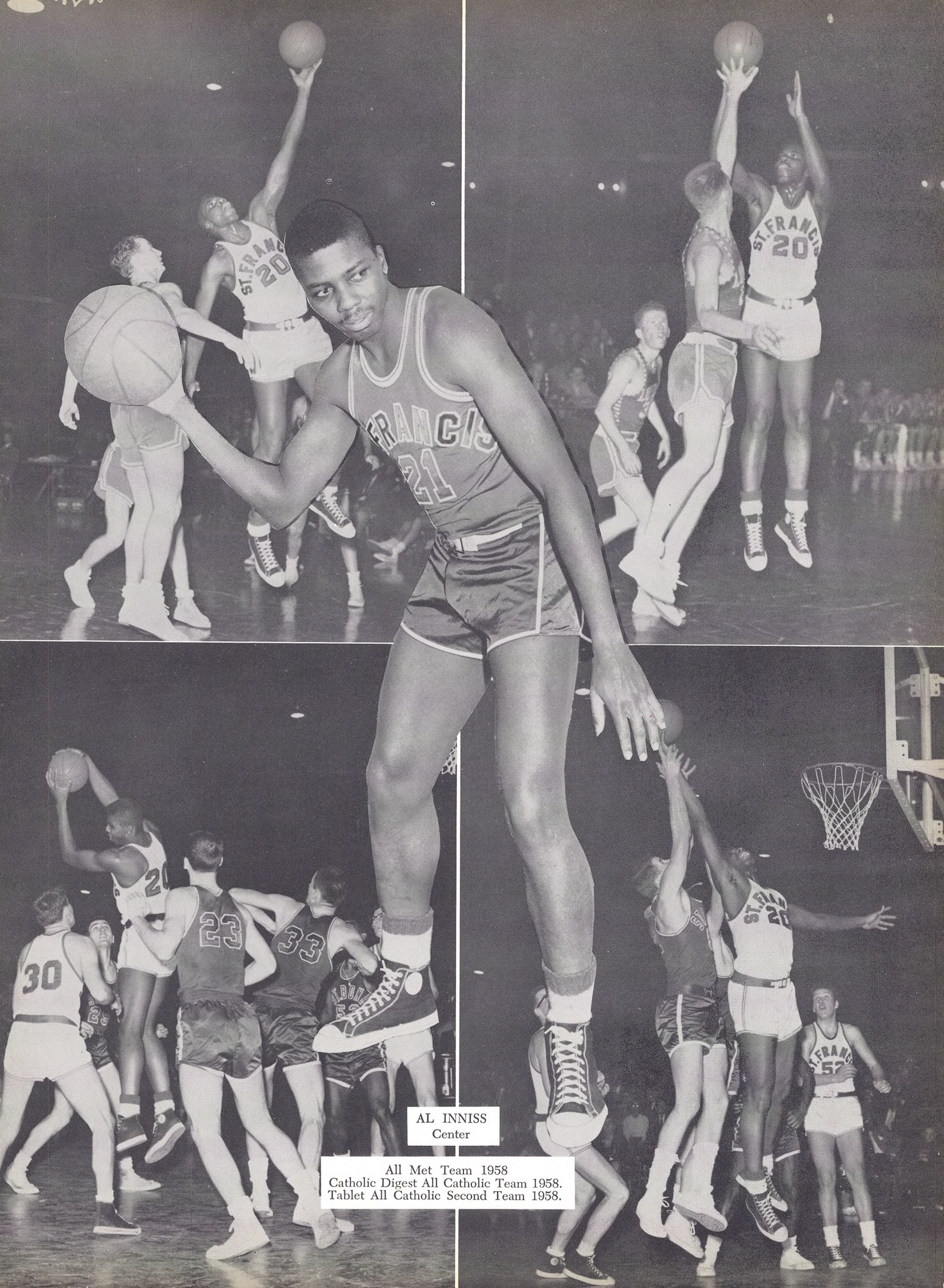

The Terriers are justly proud that they cradled the game of basketball in the metropolitan New York area. Five years after Dr. James Naismith introduced his "new" sport at Springfield, Mass., in 1891, St. Francis College played Basketball, becoming one of the pioneers in blazing the trail in intercollegiate cage schedules.

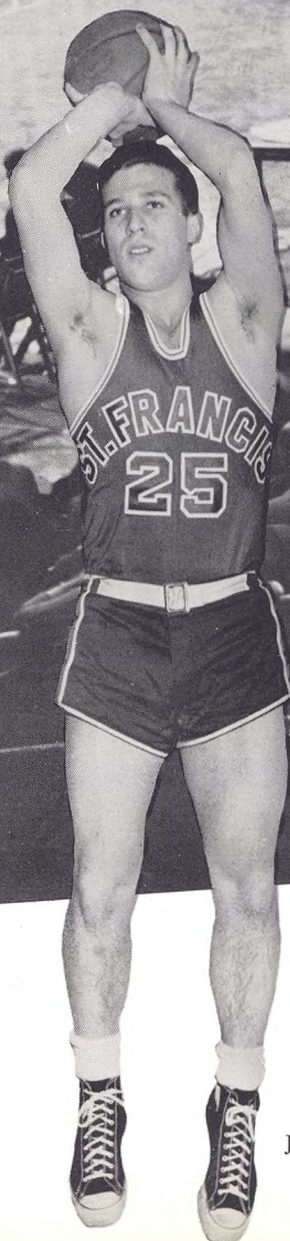
Early records pertaining to the Red and Blue quintets are not complete, for back in those years not too much attention was given to compiling accurate statistics. Scattered among these dusty, tattered records, however, are many stories and items that reflect the Franciscans' interest in basketball.

The 1904 Catalogue, for example, reveals that "its advocates are numerous among the boys" and that the college had three teams—the Seniors, the Juniors and the Midgets. In 1906, an obscure but visionary student gazed into his crystal ball and announced that in the years to come basketball would be the greatest sports attraction in the United States.

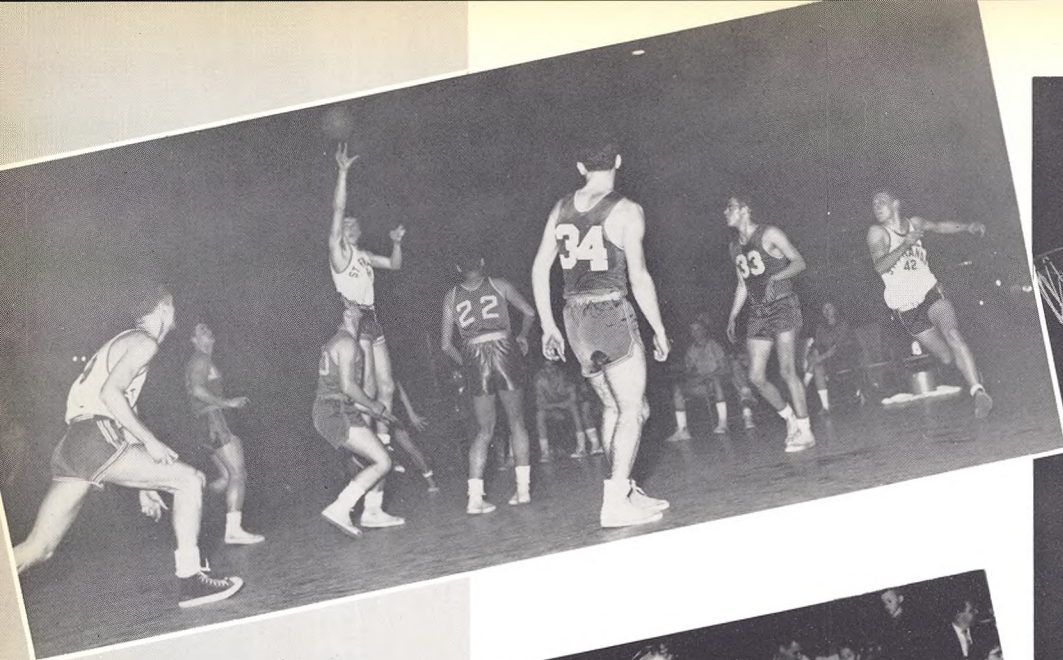

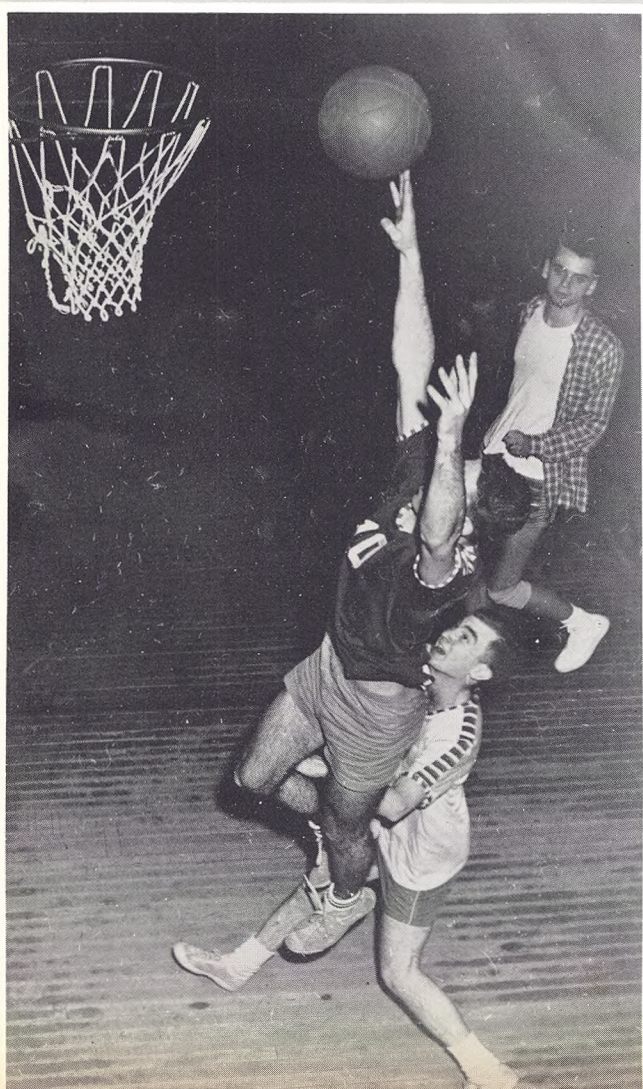

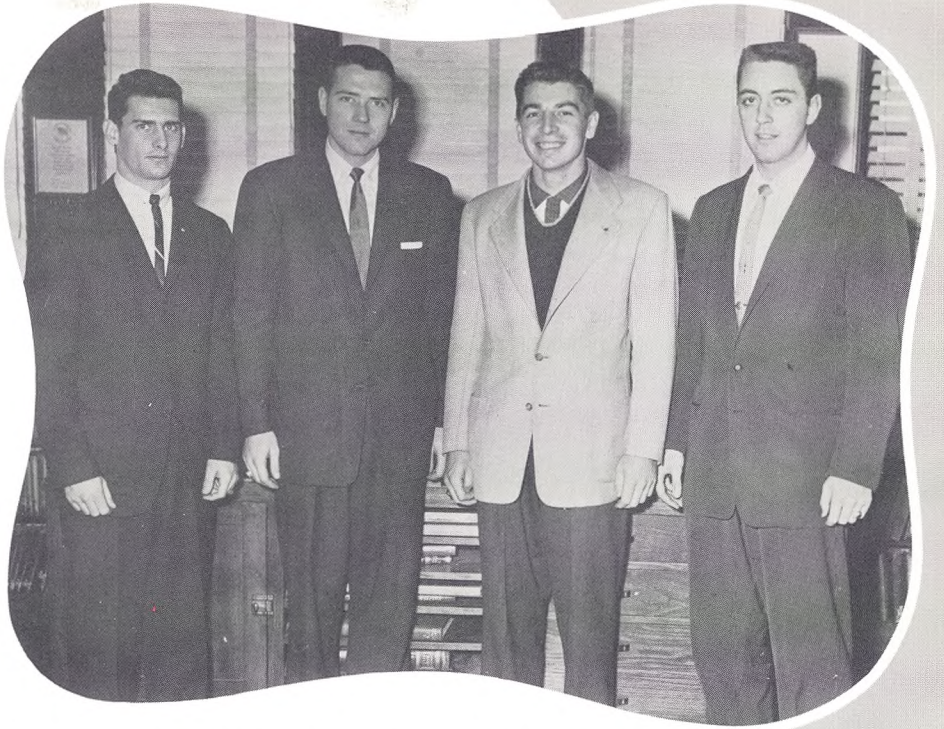

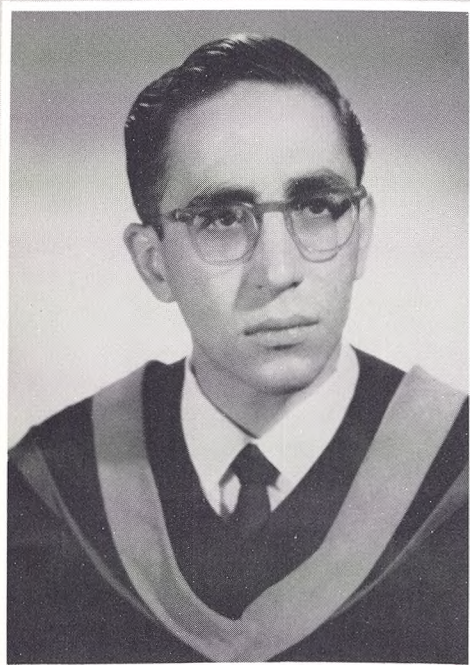

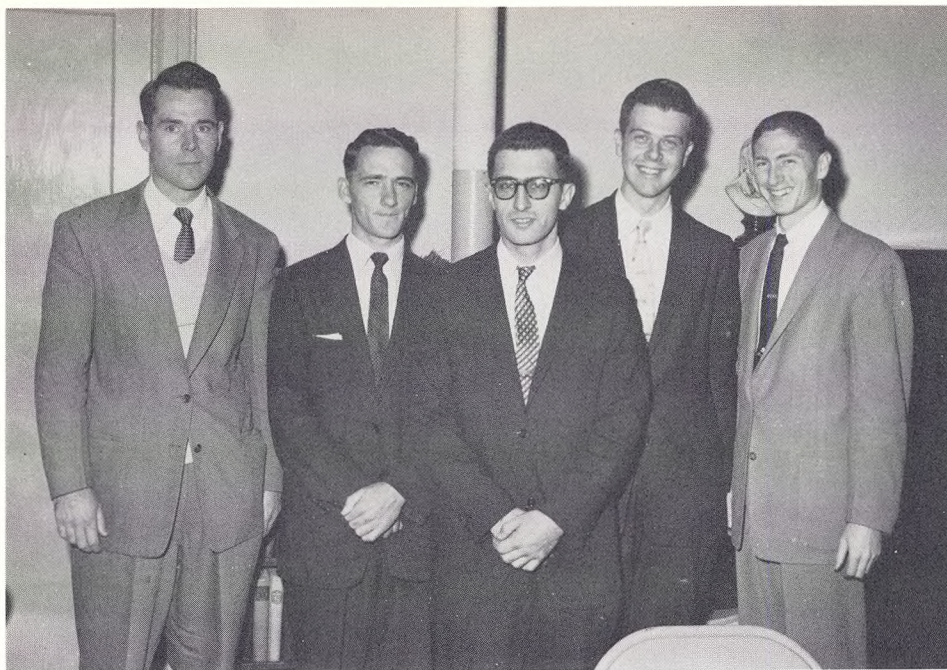

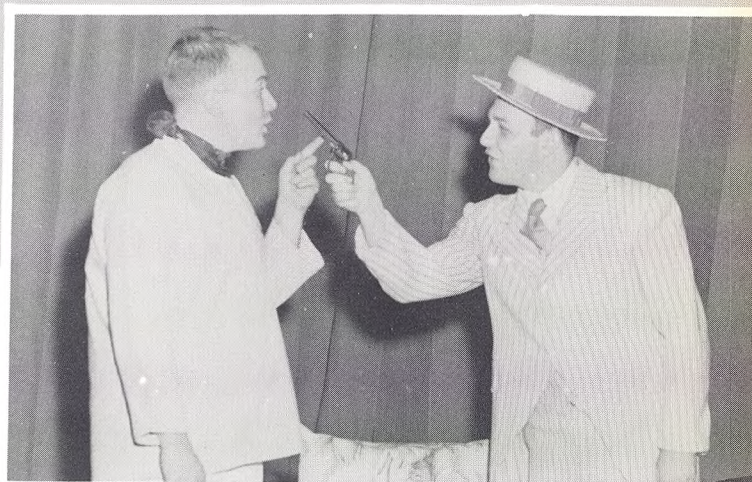


Troupers

Since its foundation, Saint Francis has had one type of theatrical group or other, except for short periods during World Wars I and II. Known as the Saint Francis Literary Union at the turn of the century, they gave a successful presentation of *Henry IV* and the *Merchant of Ghent*. In 1925, the students adopted "The Troupers" as their official title, and made *Adam and Eve* their first production under the new name. In the years that followed, comedy and musical productions were the center of concentration. Student direction, which came into focus with *The Rising of the Moon*, was continued with the production of *Death of a Salesman*. In 1955, when Brother Giles, O.S.F. assumed direction, two major productions—*The Hasty Heart* and *The Lady's Not For Burning* were staged. Since then, productions of *The Man Who Came to Dinner*, *My Three Angels*, and *Hope Is A Thing With Feathers* have won the group wide acclaim.

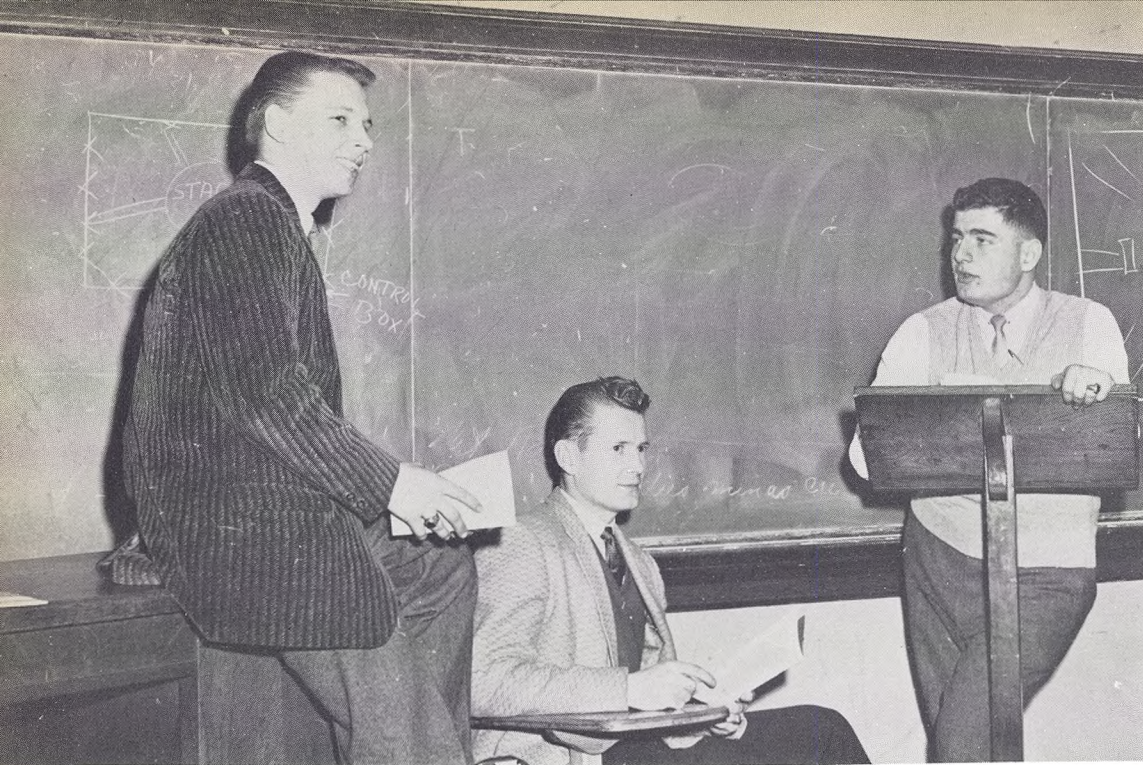

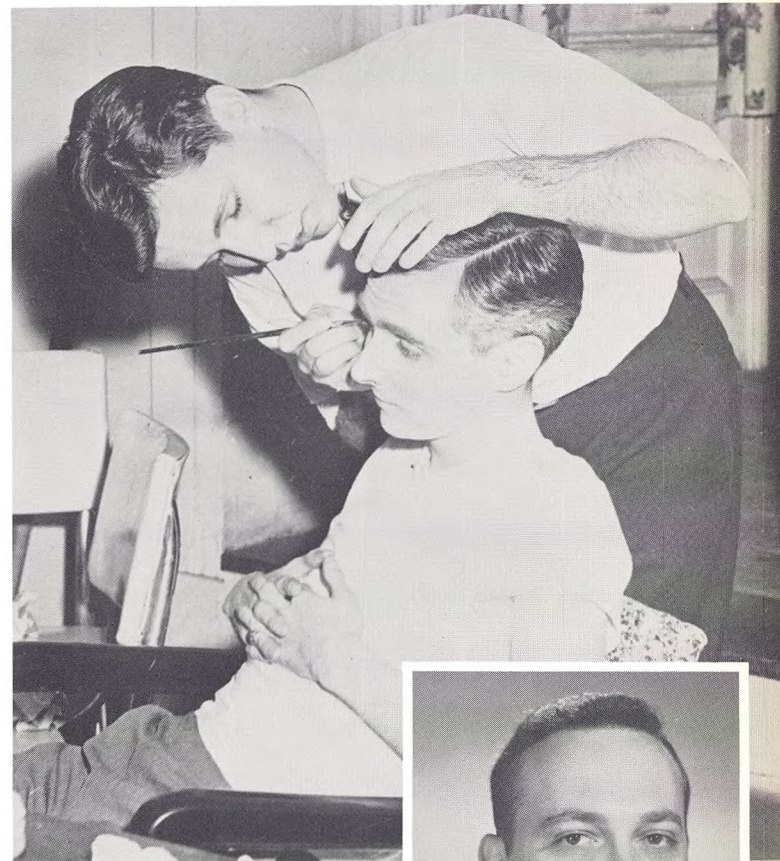

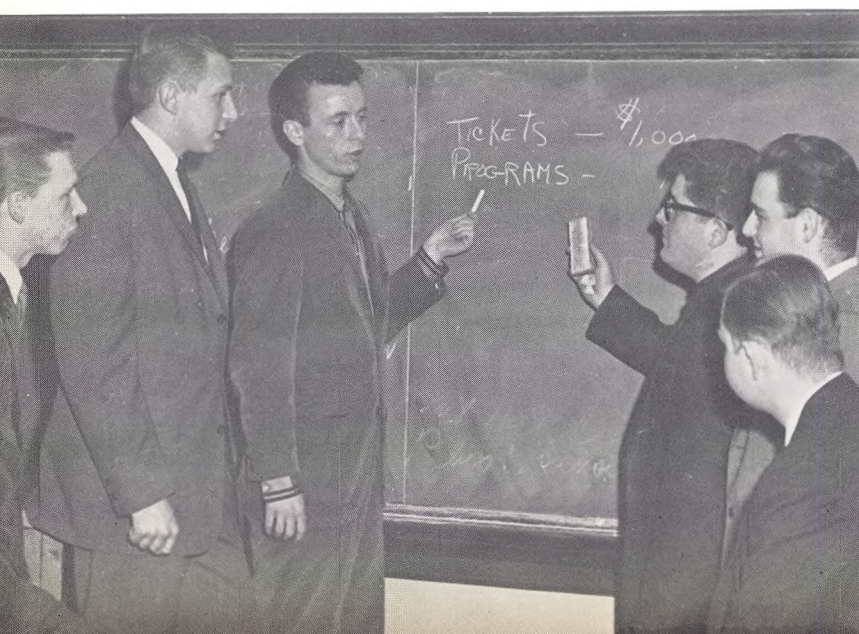

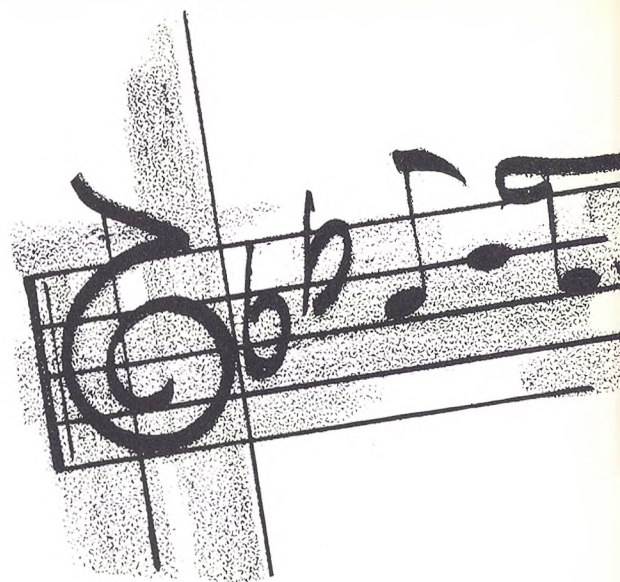

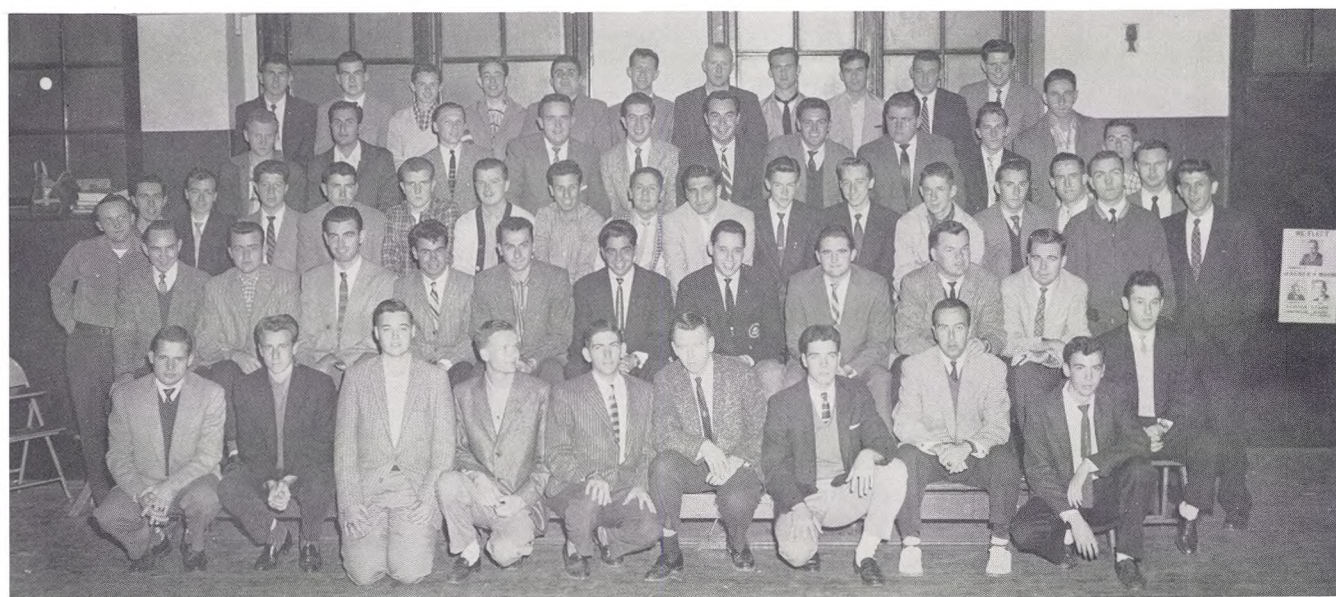

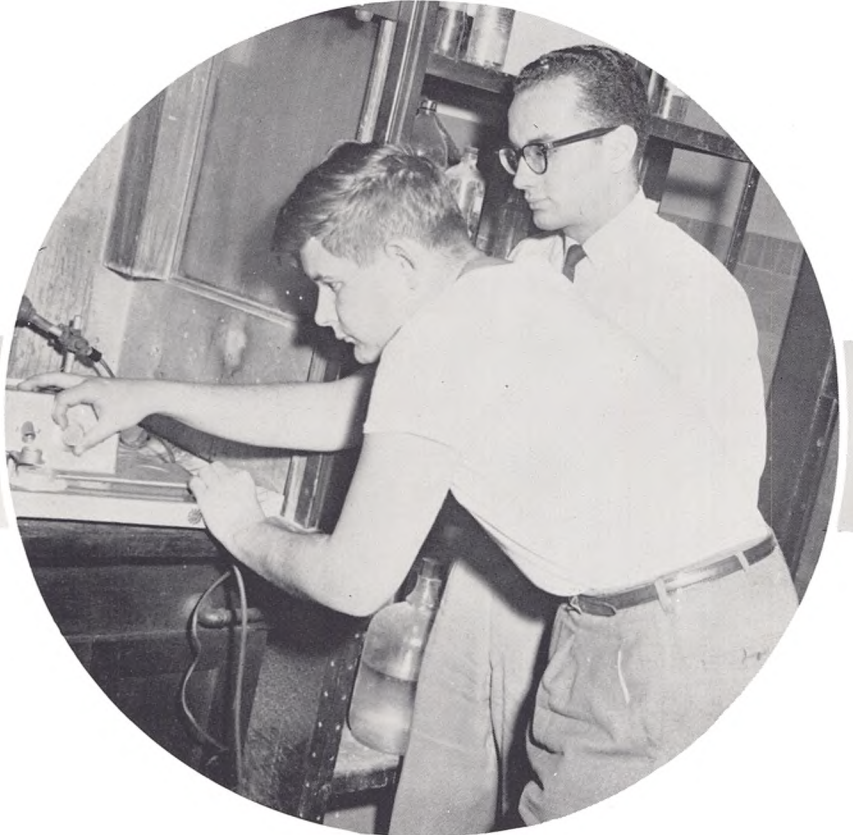
The Science Club

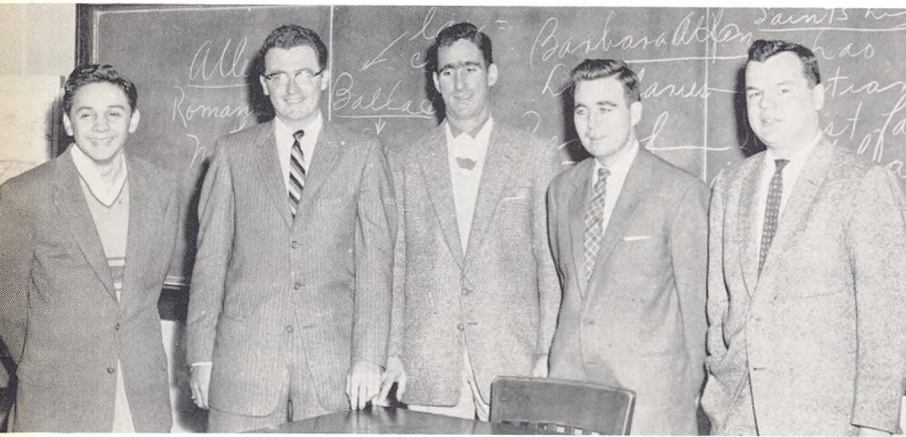

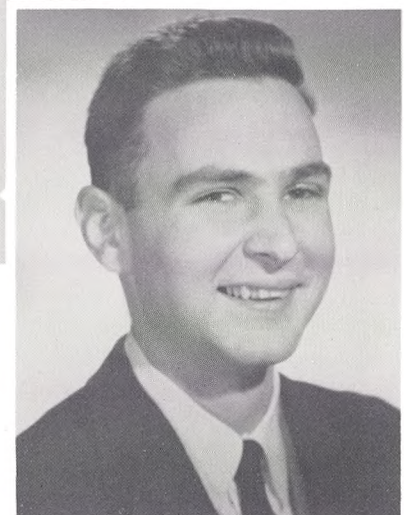

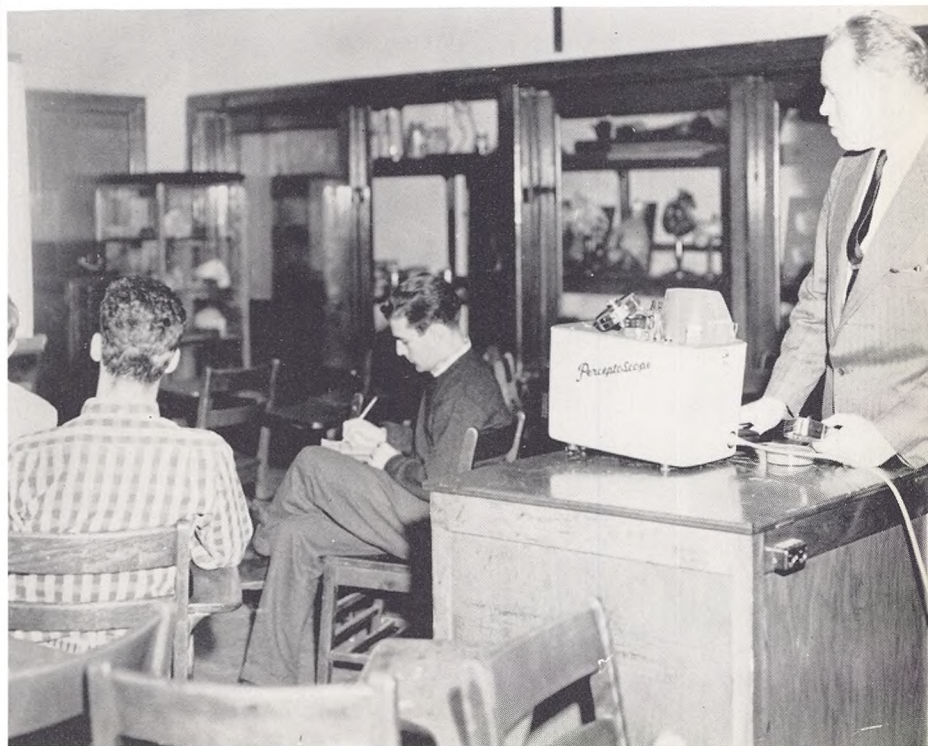

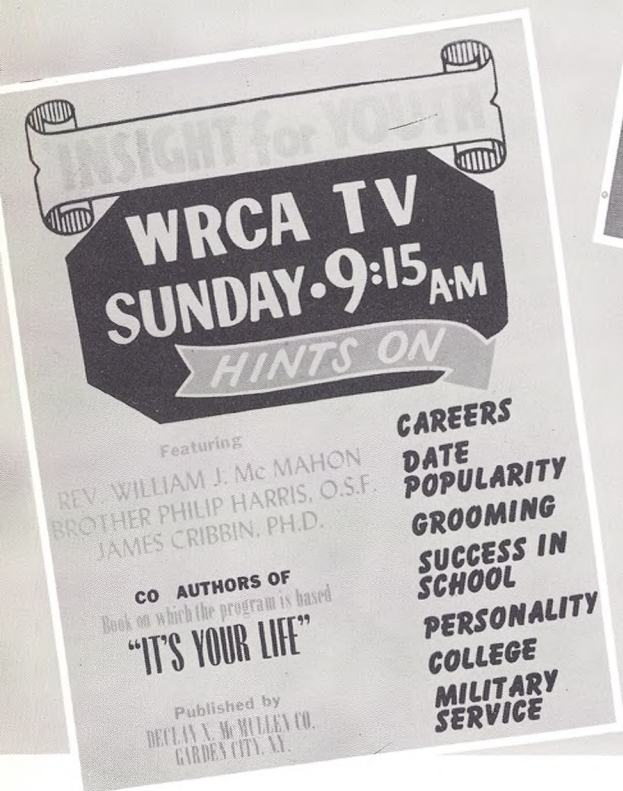

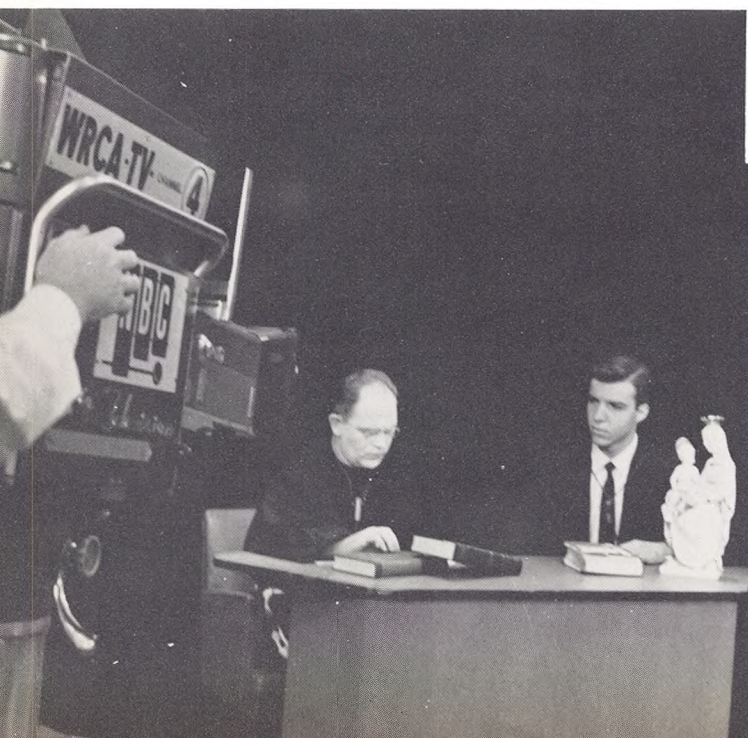

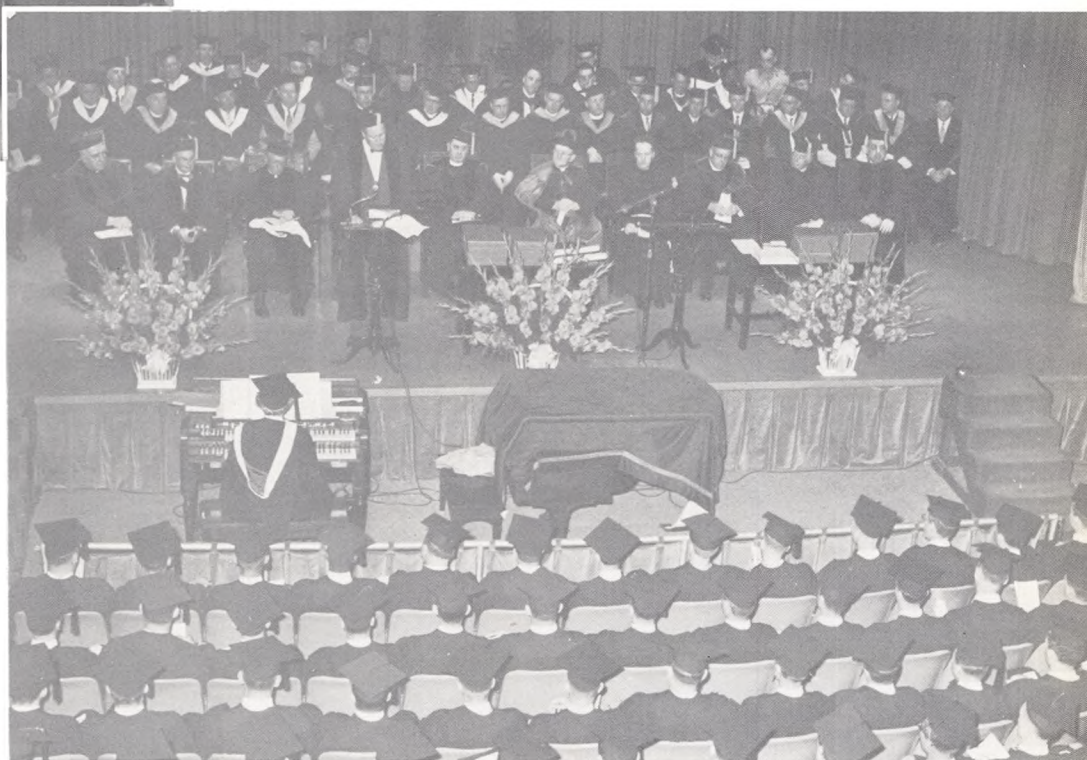
