



So farewell my unknown friend, I won't forget what I never knew. Because even if the world is sadder It is more loving... because of you.



IN 1962, MINORU YAMASAKI WAS GIVEN THE COMMISSION to design a World Trade Center on the lower west side of Manhattan. Construction of the One and Two World Trade Center began in 1966 and cost an estimated \$1.5 billion. When completed in 1973, the Center received mixed reviews, but at 1,368 and 1,362 feet and 110 stories each, the Twin Towers were the world's tallest, and largest, buildings until the Sears Tower surpassed them both in 1974.

If any of us ever thought the towers were only two immense steel, concrete, and glass modern buildings, after September 11, 2001 we realized how much we would miss the incomparable sight of the skyline, best seen on our Brooklyn Heights promenade.

The SFC, like the entire country, united and helped those affected by the disaster. We learned not to take anything for granted, to enjoy and appreciate every single day of our life in what everybody agrees to be the greatest city in the world - New York City. Ever since, UNITED WE STAND!

St. Francis College has a tradition of dedication and service that resonates like no other and all of our graduates are a testament to this. This selfless spirit was evident to me in the Class of 2002 and their generous senior gift. At the writing of this letter the class participation rate for the gift takes precedent over others and exhibits a remarkable Franciscan energy.

Remember that St. Francis College has been graced by your presence and I hope in turn, we have given you something to take with you on this next step of your journey. This year was one that was incredibly challenging for you all in many ways and on many different levels. This is the twentieth year of Joe Mingrone's directing the Troupers. We hope to many more! Congrats to senior and veteran Trouper, Elizabeth Eames!



#### Women's Softball

he St. Francis College softball team sports a 15-25 record and has already won more games in a season than any Terrier softball team in the last decade. The Terriers finished their Northeast Conference season with a 9-13 record, a marked improvement over last season's performance.

During the first weekend of conference play, the Terriers defeated both Robert Morris University and Saint Francis University of Pennsylvania, teams they had not defeated in the last ten years. Three of the Terriers' six conference losses came by one goal, including one overtime loss. Despite what was a substandard record, several members of the team turned in outstanding seasons. Sophomore forward Ricardo Ordain moved to the forefront of the team, and tallied nine goals on the season. Four of his scores were match-winners, and he registered the only three-goal "hat-trick" by a Terrier this season as he helped St. Francis to a 4-2 win over Quinnipiac University on October 31. Ordain was named the Northeast Conference and Eastern College Athletic Conference "Rookie of the Week" for the final week of the season, based on his play against Quinnipiac.

Several members of the team turned in outstanding seasons...

Junior Joseph Afful was a standout player at both ends of the field. A natural defender, Afful became an imposing offensive force for St. Francis, registering six goals and adding three assists. Afful was named to the All-Northeast Conference First Team at the end of the season, while Ordain and senior midfielder Ron Azinge were honored as Second Team All-Northeast Conference selections.

or the second straight season, the St. Francis College volleyball team entered the final match of the season with a chance to gain a berth into the Northeast Conference playoffs, but came up short of their goal with a loss on the season finale. The Terriers finished the season at 11-15 overall and 3-6 in the Northeast Conference. Highlights of the season included St. Francis' first win over Iona College in the last nine years, and winning the championship of the Long Island University Invitational in October.

After losing their first seven matches, the Terriers' season saw a ten-day break due to the events of September 11, which caused the postponement of a match at Lehigh and the cancellation of the Columbia University Invitational. St. Francis came out of the layoff with a three-match winning streak, and won eleven of their final nineteen matches.

... finished the season at 11-15 overall and 3-6 in the Northeast Conference.

The Terriers were led by junior Sylwia Parzych's .256 hitting percentage. She finished the season with totals of 248 kills, 31 aces, 151 digs, and 66 blocks. Junior Julie Acuff added 211 kills, a .219 hitting percentage, 20 aces, 228 digs, and 54 blocks. The setting duties were handled by junior Sylwia Turek, who surpassed the 950-assist plateau for the second straight year and finished with 955 assists, while adding team highs if 35 aces and 329 digs. Senior Erica Predergast was a force at the net and ended the year with 73 blocks. Sophomore Brittany Daniel paced the Terriers with 293 kills and added 254 digs and 24 aces.

## Joseph Marvel



The measure of a man is not the number of his servants, but the number of people he serves!

MR. JOSEPH MARVEL HAS RETIRED during the Spring semester of 2002 after approximately 30 years of service as a registrar. He has been a registrar at SFC since 1993. During these nine years, Joe, as all of us like to call him, has not stopped to amaze us with his energy, attention to detail, and most of all, with his tremendous desire to help and guide us, his students. As yearbook editor-in-chief, I always counted on his help to obtain information on the graduating class, not an easy thing to do considering the hundreds of students who graduate from St. Francis every year.

As a sign of gratitude and appreciation, the Student Government Association awarded him this year with one of the most precious awards, a once-in-a-lifetime achievement, the Franciscan Spirit Award. On Charter Day, Joe was awarded the Honorary Degree, for his service, scholarship and individual character.

Talking to Joe on numerous occasions, I learned so many beautiful things about him, his life outside the college, his family and his passions. Before mentioning his achievements, I would like to write about what impressed me most: he told me once that "instead of just conducting business with the students, I try to give a life-changing experience." He tried to help his students understand the dimensions of their actions, making a profession out of his job as a registrar.

Joe Marvel has never taken the decision to become a registrar. He started working in the Registrar office while a student, and just "fell into it," as he explained. Since 1973 until 1993 he was registrar at SUNY Educational Opportunity Center in Brooklyn. Before becoming a registrar, he served as grant coordinator at SUNY for one year; as assistant director of student affairs (1969-1971) and head resident for men (1966-1969). Joe Marvel joined the United States Army from 1963 until 1966, and he was an Intelligence Corps officer in Des Moines, Iowa. His love for discipline and his excellent organizational skills led him to hold positions such as assistant supervisor of fraternities and sororities, intake counselor and resident felow from 1961 until 1963.

In 1961, Joe received his A.B. in American Studies, an interdepartmental program of English, history, social sciences and fine arts at the University of Delaware. In 1966, he completed his M.S. in Higher Education with the Southern Illinois University, and in 1978 he received a Certificate in Psychotherapy at the Alfred Adler Institute in New York. Joe stressed the importance of being able to listen and to understand people. Throughout his life, he embraced the influence of the two Adlers as model for both his family life and his professional one. He stressed the importance of respect for other people, and also the importance of looking at one's actions, and not at one's words.

Married to Carolyn (uncoincidentally at the United Nations Chapel), Joe has two children who have chosen very diverse professions, son Owen graduating from the Culinary Institute of America, while daughter Kimberlin choosing the computers and marketing information systems.

Among his hobbies, Joe loves poetry, and collects art and photography. Since he can't bring another picture in the house, "because my wife is going to kill me:)", he gives them to her as presents.









