WELCOME OUR HISTORY



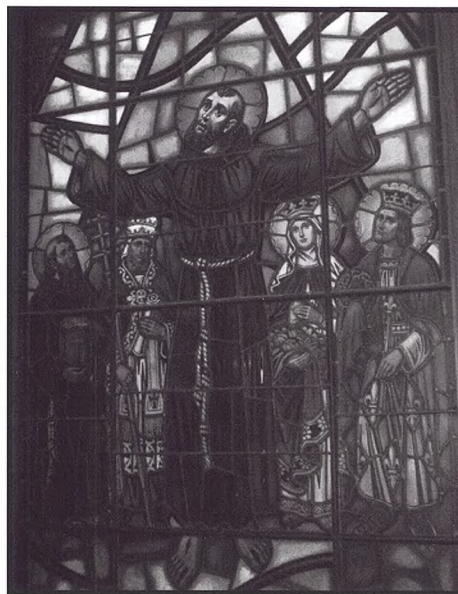
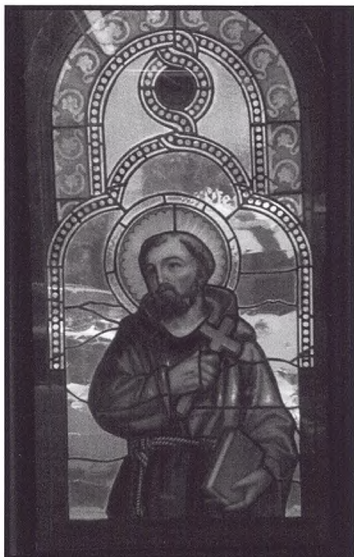
WHILE TODAY IT IS KNOWN AS “THE SMALL COLLEGE OF BIG DREAMS,” SFC WAS FOUNDED IN 1859 BY FRANCISCAN BROTHERS AS ST. FRANCIS ACADEMY. OVER TWO DECADES LATER, THE TRUSTEES OF THE SCHOOL RECEIVED PERMISSION FROM THE STATE LEGISLATURE TO ESTABLISH A “LITERARY COLLEGE” UNDER ITS CURRENT NAME, GIVING IT THE POWER TO CONFER DIPLOMAS, HONORS, AND DEGREES. IN THE YEARS FOLLOWING, THE SCHOOL WOULD CONTINUE TO GROW EXPONENTIALLY, AND BY 1926 THE GROWTH HAD NECESSITATED THE CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW FACILITY ON BUTLER STREET. FOLLOWING THE PURCHASE OF TWO OFFICE BUILDINGS FROM BROOKLYN UNION GAS COMPANY, THE COLLEGE WOULD MAKE THE MOVE TO REMSEN STREET. SHORTLY THEREAFTER, IT BECAME A CO-EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION AND ADDITIONAL PROPERTY WAS PURCHASED IN REMSEN AND JORALEMEON STREETS. RECENTLY, THE COLLEGE HAS EXPANDED ITS FACILITIES WITH THE CONSTRUCTION OF A SCIENCE BUILDING, PHYSICAL EDUCATION COMPLEX, AND THE RECENTLY RECHRISTENED FRANK J. AND MARY MACCHIAROLA ACADEMIC CENTER. TODAY, THE COLLEGE CONTINUES TO THRIVE, WITH MORE THAN 2,500 STUDENTS, AND 16,000 ALUMNI BRINGING THE FRANCISCAN SPIRIT TO THEIR RESPECTIVE PROFESSIONS.

Stimulates interest in psychology, specifically in those areas that are not covered in course work. This goal is achieved by means of guest lecturers and field trips that open to all students.

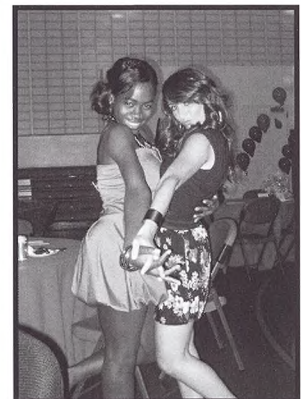
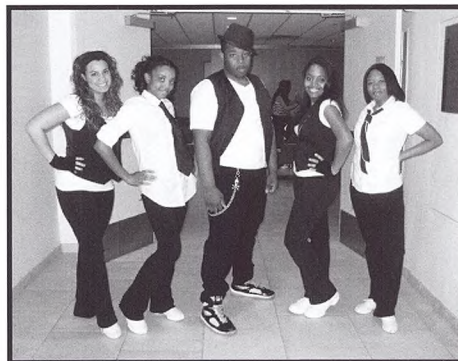
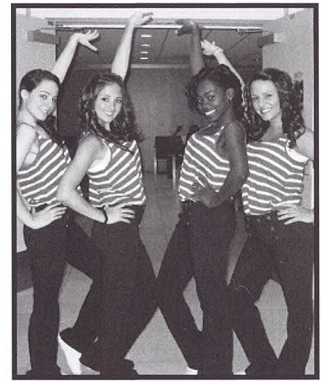
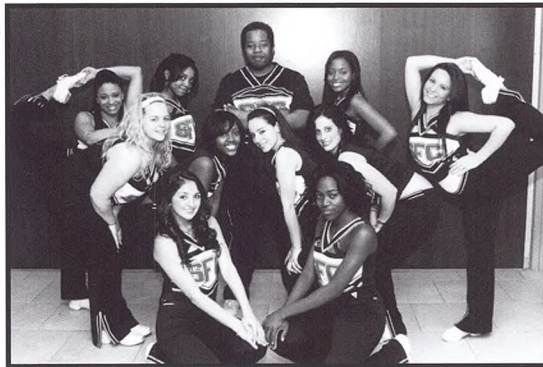
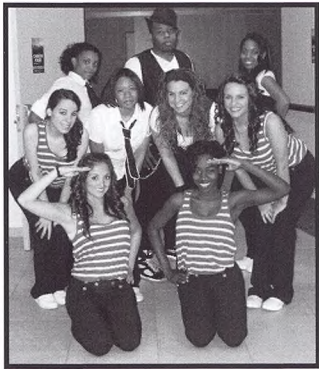

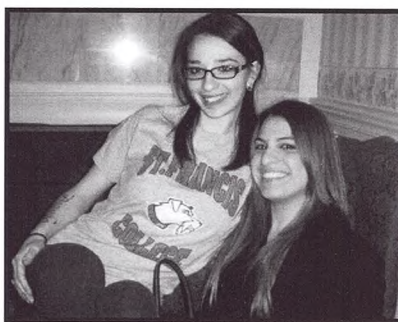
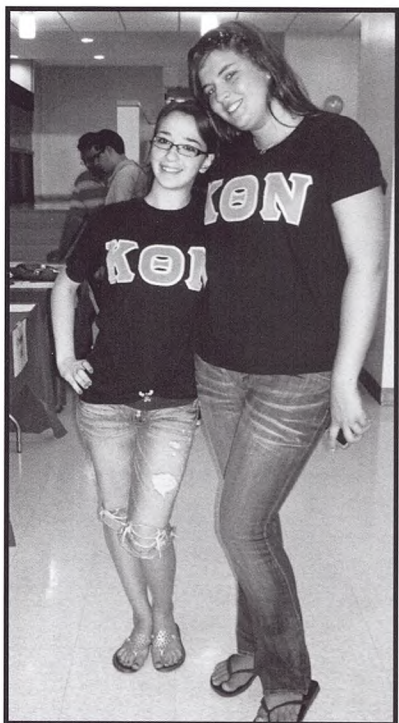
Alpha Sigma Sorority is a regional, social sorority that was founded at SFC in 2006. Their primary philanthropies are breast cancer and autism awareness.



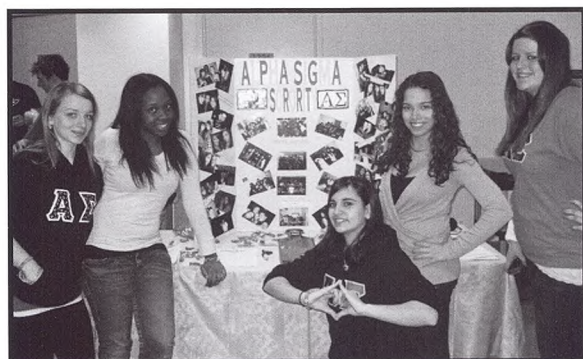


Kappa Theta Nu Sorority

KON was founded in SFC in the Spring of 2010. Their primary philanthropy is Childhood Diabetes. They also promote women's studies and community development.



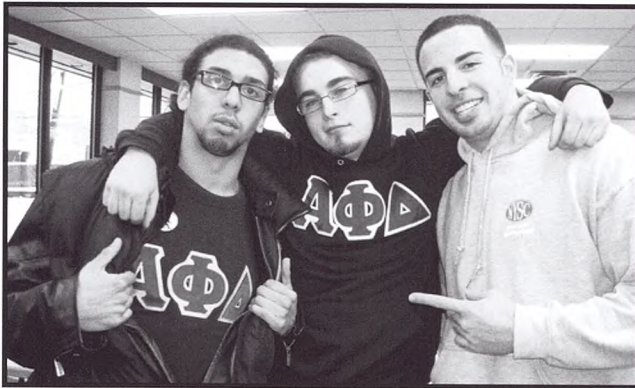
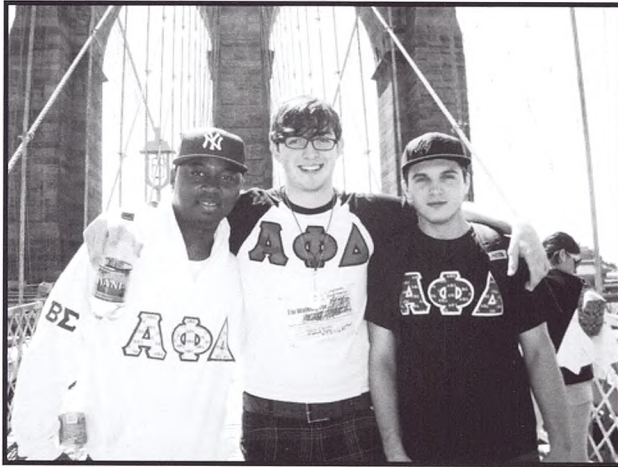
