INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS CLUB

The fall semester of the 1966-67 academic year was probably the most successful half year in the history of the International Relations Club. The annual Political Forum, concentrating on the gubernatorial race and various local races, provided the student body and faculty with an exciting and interesting program.

Gene Swanzey-President, began working on the program in early August. He contacted Governor Rockefeller's office and in late August he received a reply indicating that the chief executive was extremely interested in speaking at the college. Contacts were then made with all the possible Democratic Party,

Liberal Party and Conservative Party nominees. Definite commitments were established in late September and Rockefeller was the first candidate to appear in the forum. He addressed an extremely large audience in the first week of October. Franklin D. Roosevelt, Jr., the Liberal Party nominee, then appeared the following week. The Democratic nominee, Frank O'Connor, addressed a large portion of the student body during the third week of October; and during the final week before elections, Paul Adams and Kieran O'Doherty, the Conservative nominees, addressed an equally large throng.

Thus, with the concerted efforts of Mr. Swanzey,
