




JAMES A. KELLY INSTITUTE


The James A. Kelly Institute was opened in 1973 and is named after the first official Historian of the Borough of Brooklyn. The Director of the institute, Mr. Arthur Konop, is well known in archival circles. He is presently serving on various committees of the city and state in an advisory capacity.

The institute houses almost 4 million documents. Included in this collection are the Town Records of the original 6 towns of Brooklyn, the Brooklyn Council Minutes, Congressman John J. Rooney and Eugene Keogh Collections. There are also several other collections as well as 10,000 maps and various paraphernalia related to Brooklyn History.

The institute is open Monday through Friday during regular office hours to all graduate students, college students and the general public as well.
