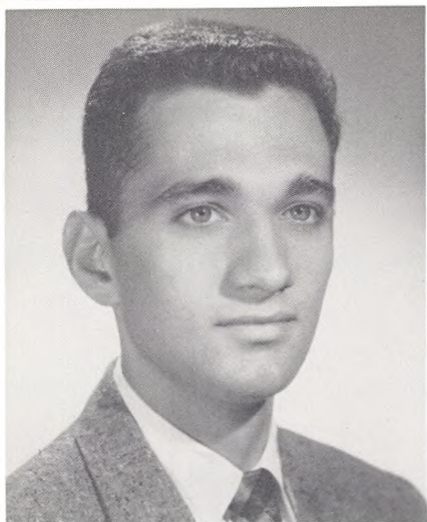


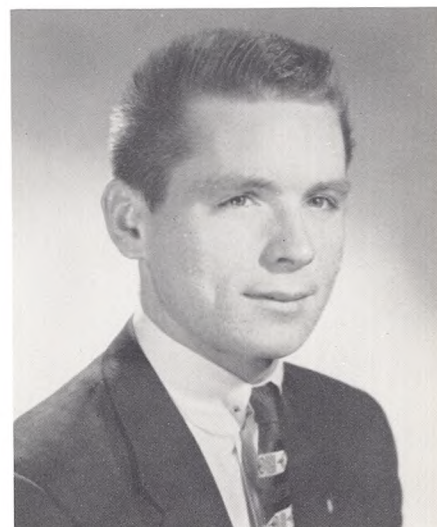

Vets' Club School Dance Limited to 1st Sixty Couples

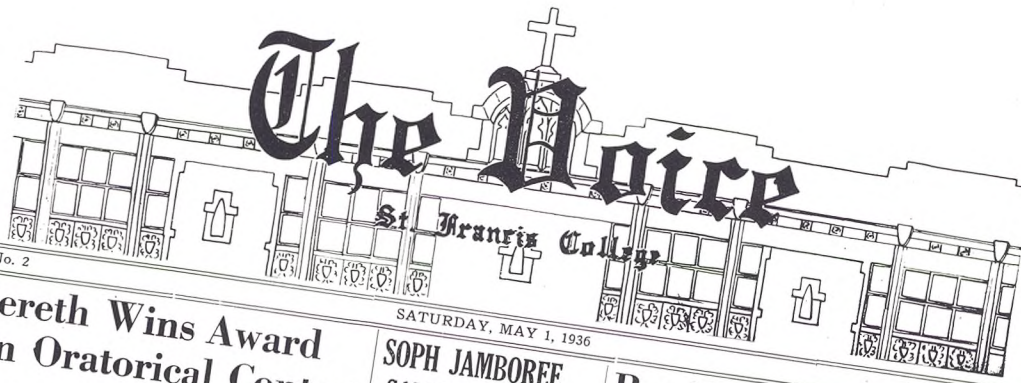
