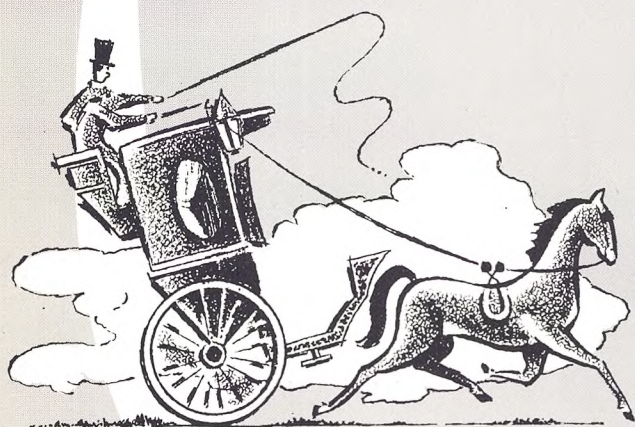
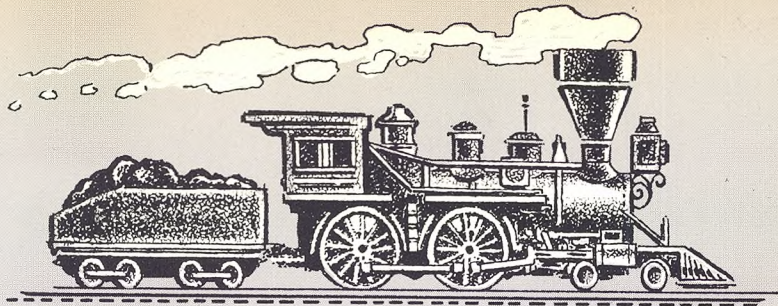

## Dedication

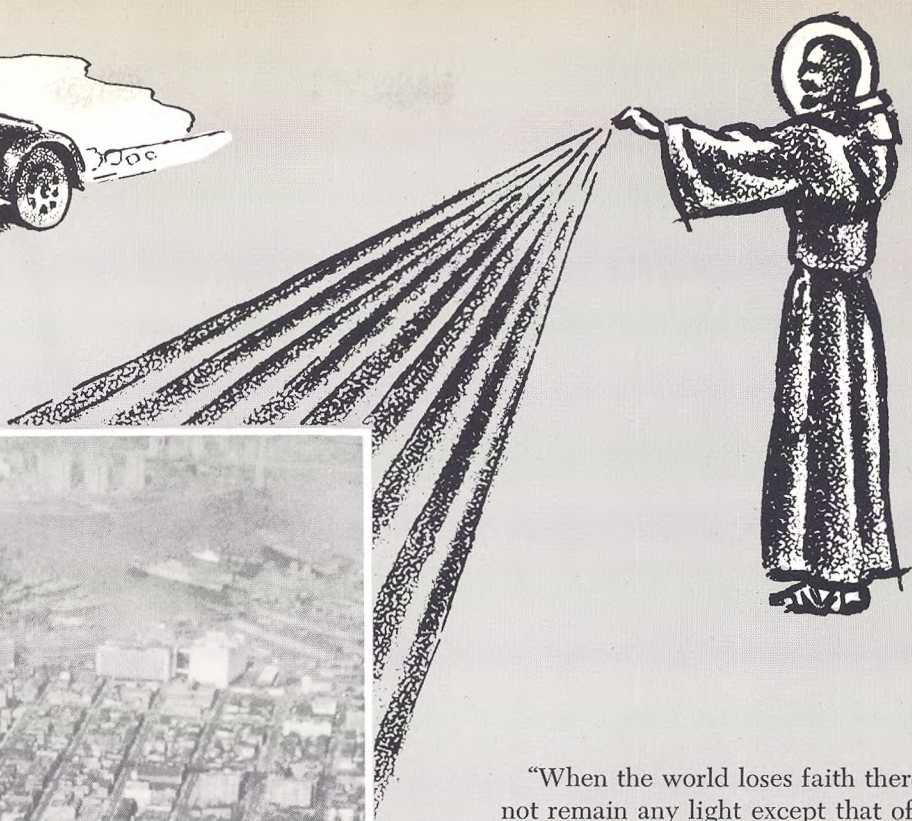
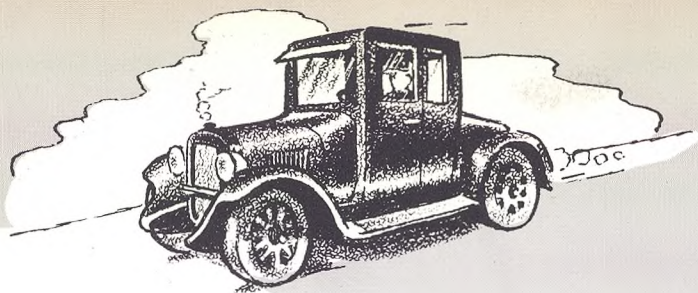
**W**E DEDICATE the Saint Francis College Annual to the Franciscan Brothers of Brooklyn on the occasion of their Centennial Anniversary.

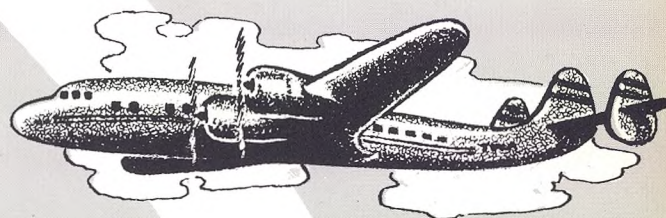
