

THE DUNS SCOTUS HONOR SOCIETY

Founded in 1935, the Society is named for Blessed Duns Scotus, a Franciscan scholar and champion of Our Lady's Immaculate Conception. Pope Pius IX incorporated the explanation of Blessed Duns Scotus into the dogma proclaimed in 1854. In 1209, St. Francis of Assisi dedicated the Franciscan Order to the Blessed Mother, which celebrates on its calendar the Feast of Mary, Queen of the Franciscan Order, December 15th, the octave of the Immaculate Conception.

Election to membership in the Society is based on high scholastic standing, participation in extra-curricular activities, evidence of loyalty to the ideals of St. Francis College and demonstration of a true Franciscan spirit. At commencement, each member has the privilege of wearing the distinctive red and blue tassel on the cap. Membership does not cease at graduation.
