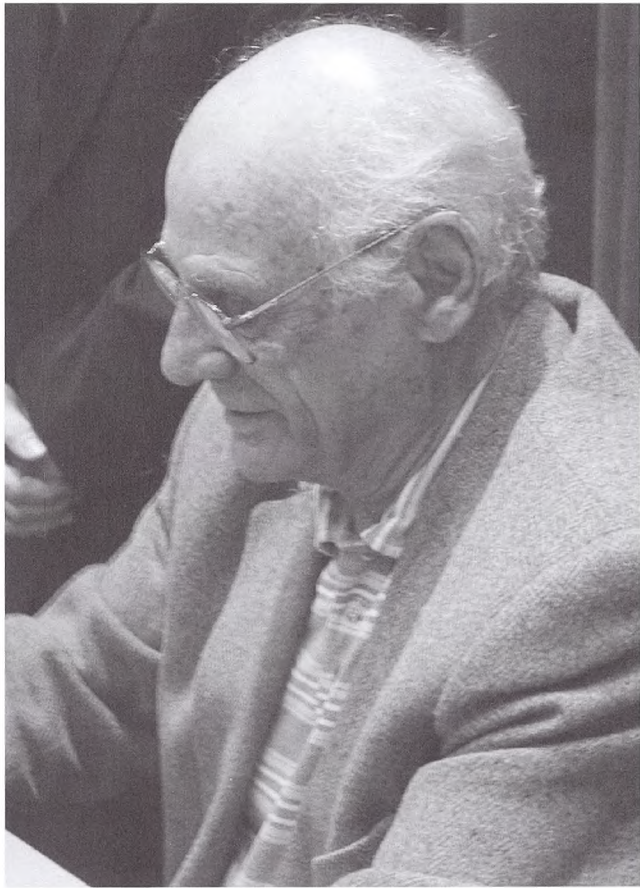




Fall Back to Summer

Arthur Miller

On Friday April 23rd and Saturday April 24th, 2004 SFC hosted the ninth annual Arthur Miller Conference. The event, which is sponsored by the Arthur Miller Society, included numerous lectures, a walking tour of Miller's Brooklyn Heights' haunts and a special visit from Miller himself. President Macchiarola stated that Miller's return "reminds us of the important role that Brooklyn Heights has in the literary tradition of our region and the country." Miller, a Pulitzer Prize winning playwright who grew up in Brooklyn and Harlem, is the author of such classics as The Crucible and The Death of a Salesman. Miller gave a straightforward talk that touched on many things including his lackadaisical approach to academics. Miller struck most people as a humble, down to earth person who hadn't his success go to his head. Sadly, Miller passed away early this February.

Miller who often wrote about families coping with ethical and moral issues died surrounded by his family.
