



An Amtrak train fell off a bridge into a bayou in Saraland, Alabama in the early morning of September 22, 1993. 47 people perished while 159 survived, making this the deadliest train wreck in Amtrak history.



Sheik Omar Abdel-Rahman, a blind cleric and in exile from Egypt, was indicted on August 25, 1993 for being the mastermind behind the World Trade Center bombing. Rahman denied his involvement, denouncing the bombing.
