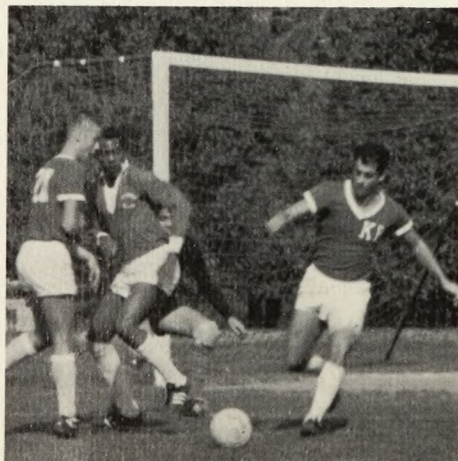
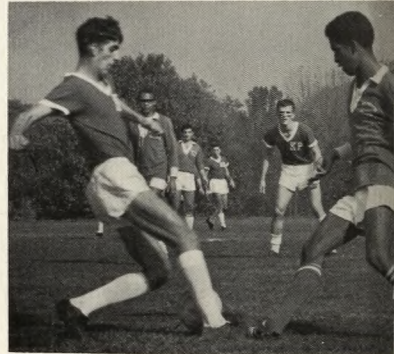
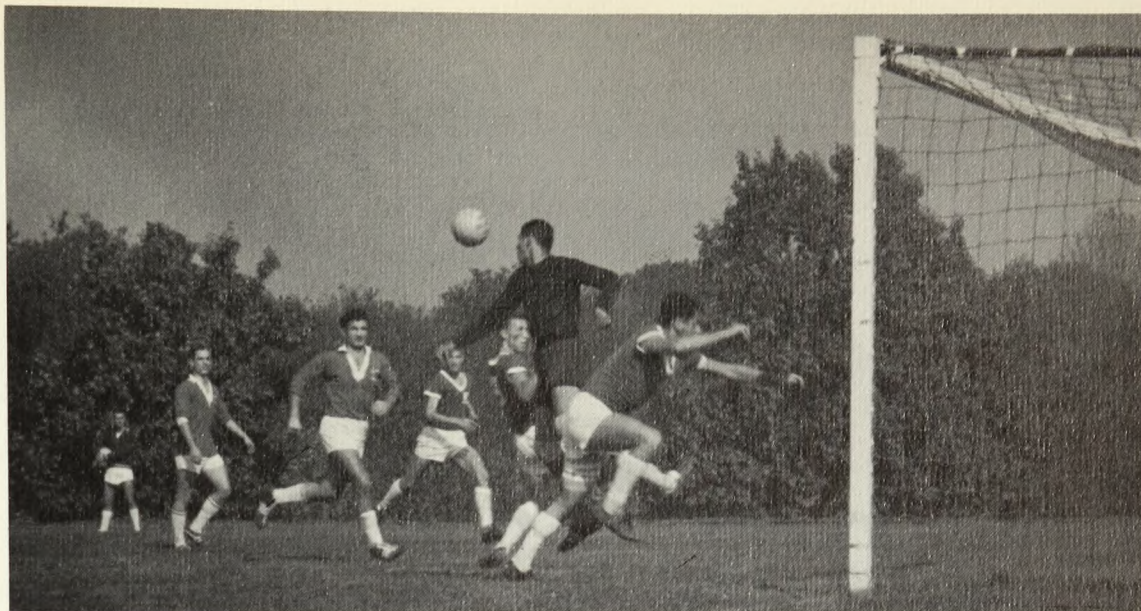


S O C C E R
