This was the "big game" for the Setters and they certainly gave it the old college try. Their cagers, unable to cope with the superior Franciscan height, hustled from start to finish.

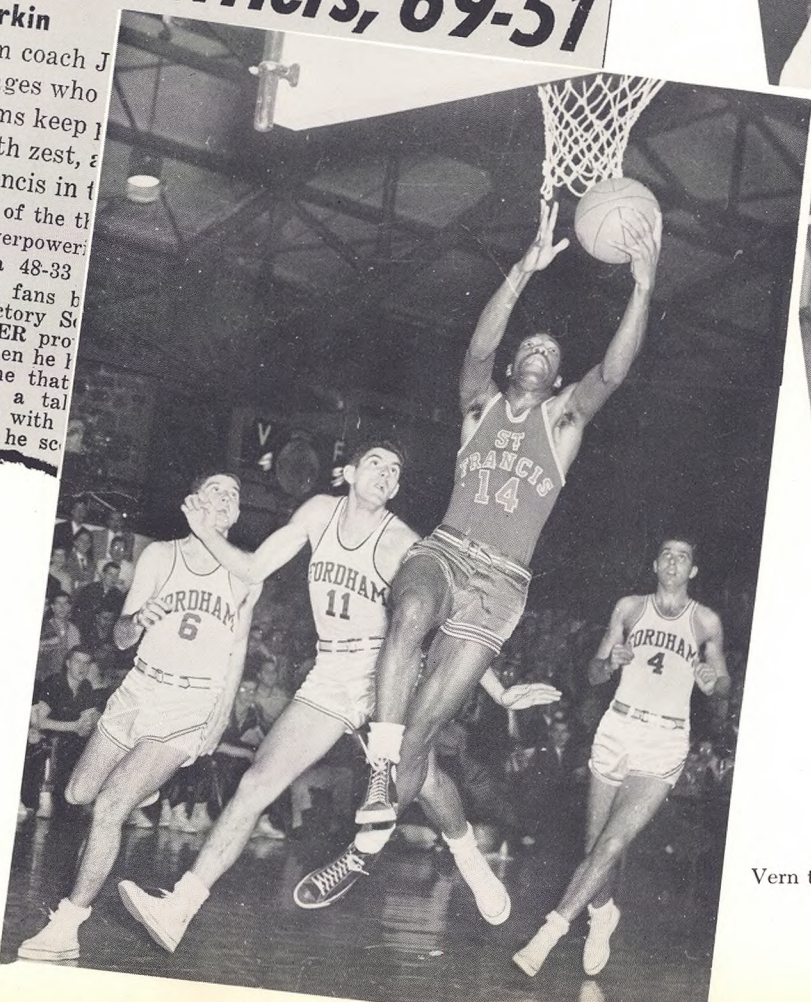
Pace entered the game under a handicap since their leading scorer, Iggy Dubinsson, had been declared ineligible for the afternoon.
