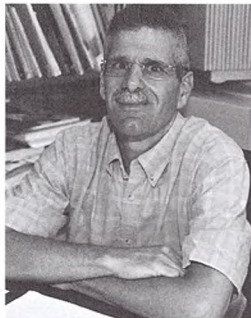
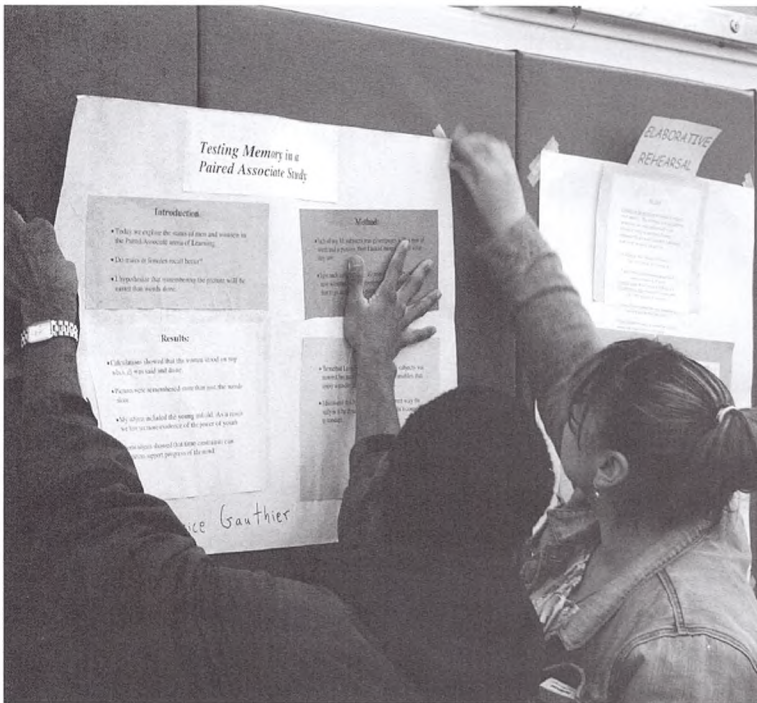
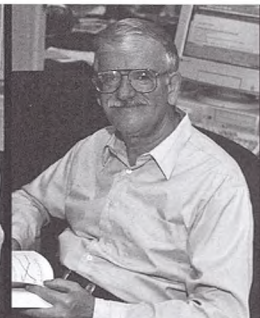


# Psychology
