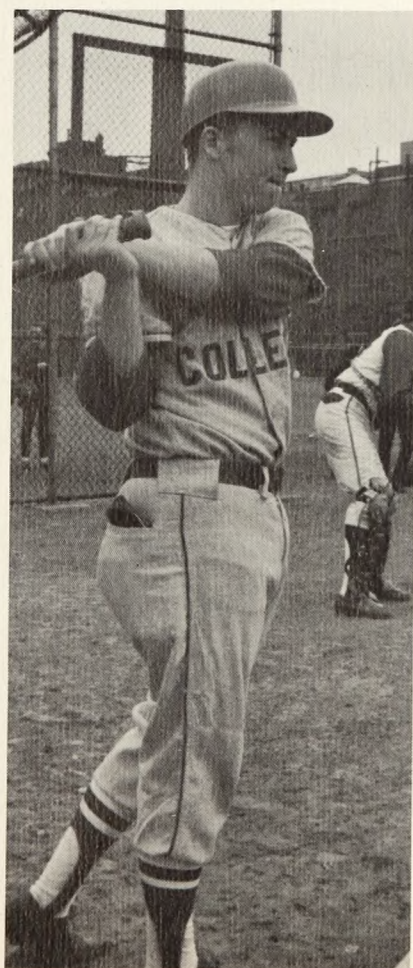


B A S E B A L L
