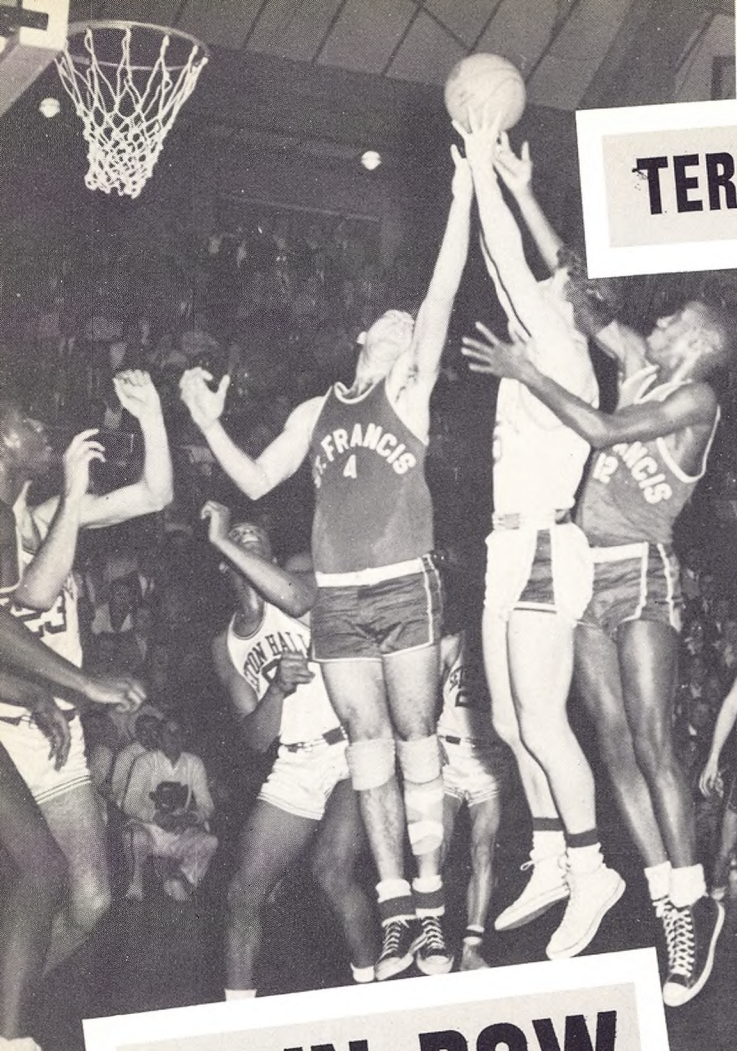
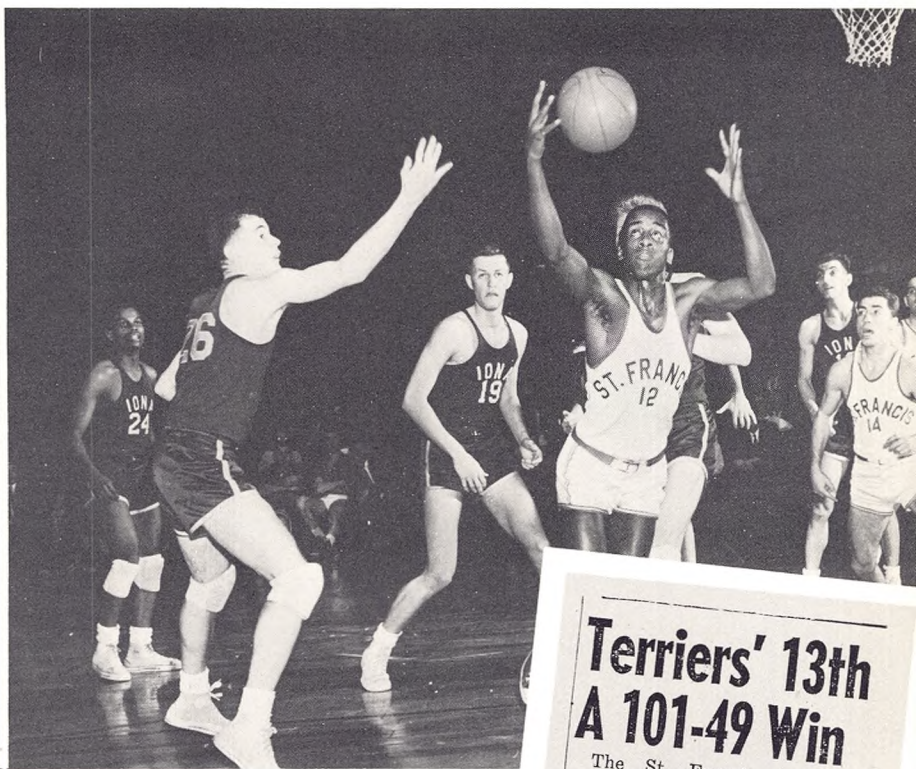

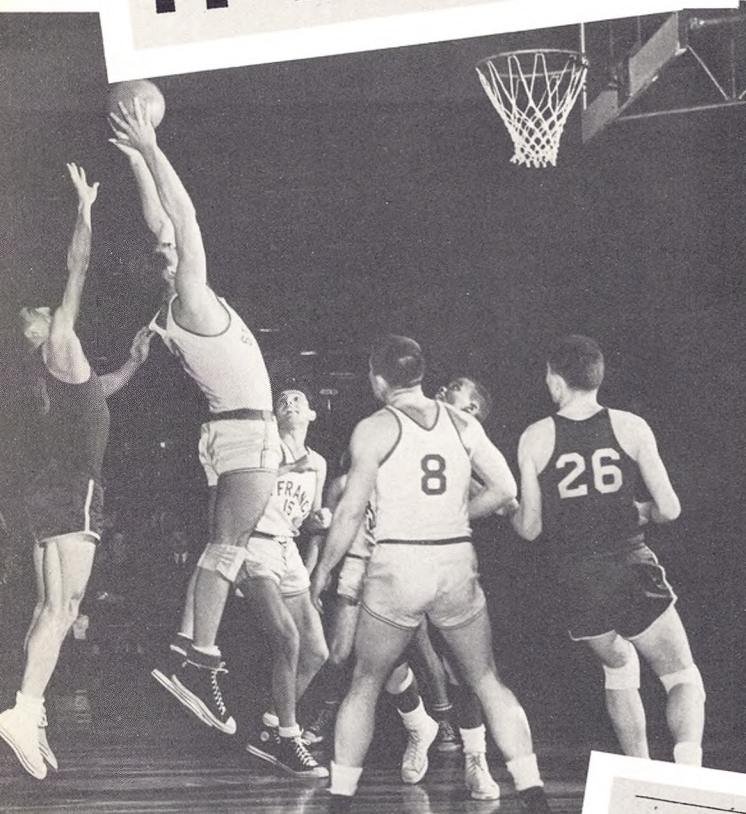


Terriers' 13th A 101-49 Win

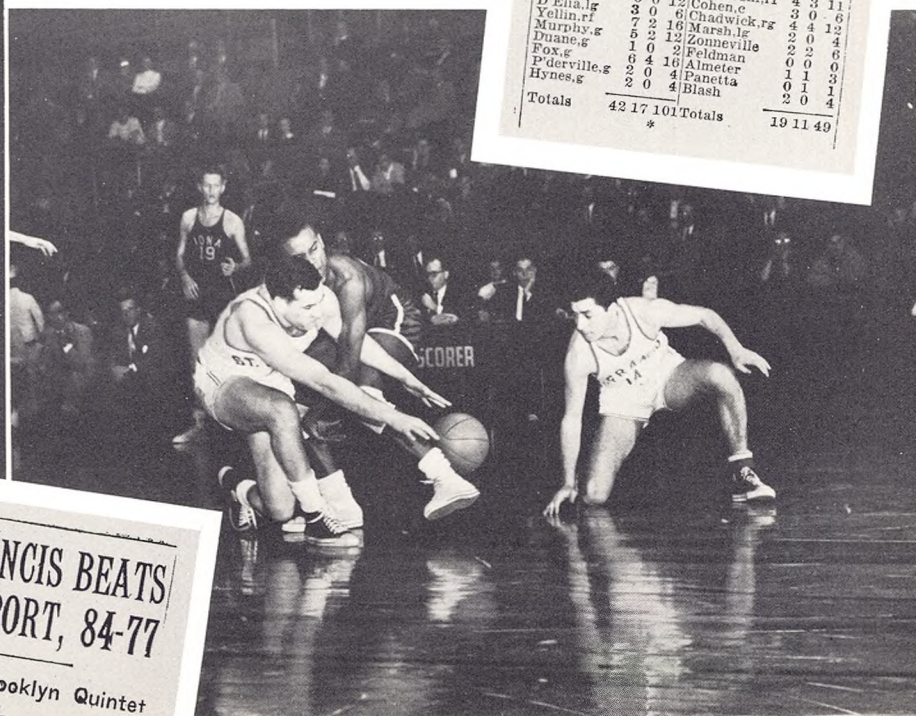
