

he Terrier women swung their rackets more positively this fall, finishing with an 8-4 overall record, a major improvement over last spring's 2-7 finish and 1988's 0-3 campaign. "It took a concerted effort on the team's part," said second year coach Tom Cassidy, a St. Francis alumnus, who also coached Xavier High School to two Mayor's Cup tournaments in the last five years.



Senior Valerie Waterman finished 8-2 in singles play and 5-7 in doubles. The rest of the team did equally well in both single and double play, showing that great St. Francis spirit and talent. The Lady Terriers finished in eighth place in the Northeast Conference.













Lady Terriers junior center Karen Erving, who toiled hard under the boards the past two and a half seasons for the Terriers to accumulate 643 total rebounds, is ranked 20th in the nation in rebounding by the latest NCAA Div. 1 women's basketball poll. This accomplishment is the second of its kind for Erving as she was ranked 23rd in scoring by the same poll last year.







John Arnold, a sophomore guard from St. Francis, was named the Most Valuable Player of the 15th annual "Battle of Brooklyn" basketball game. Arnold helped pace his team to a 74-63 victory in the Northeast Conference game in which he scored 10 points, 6 free throws, 6 rebounds, 6 assists, and was credited with 1 steal in 40 minutes of action.

Terrier center Terryl Coombs was named Northeast Conference Newcomer of the week, taking the honor for the second straight week. Coombs was also ranked nationally by the NCAA in field goal percentage and rebound categories.

Anthony Robinson was also ranked nationally by the NCAA. He was ranked no. 12 in rebounding averaging 11.5 boards after six games. He was the third leading rebounder in the NEC at season's end last year. Robinson was NEC Newcomer of the Weel also.
