



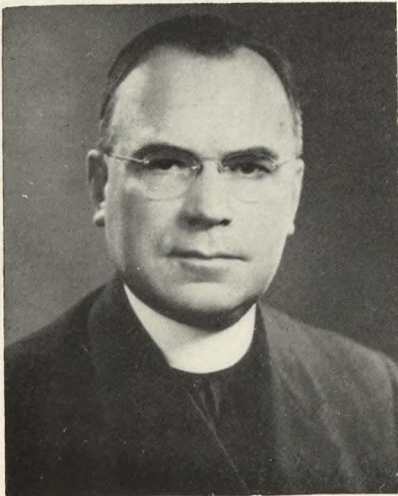
LANGUAGES

The basis of modern civilization is rooted in the foundations of the Greeks and the Romans.



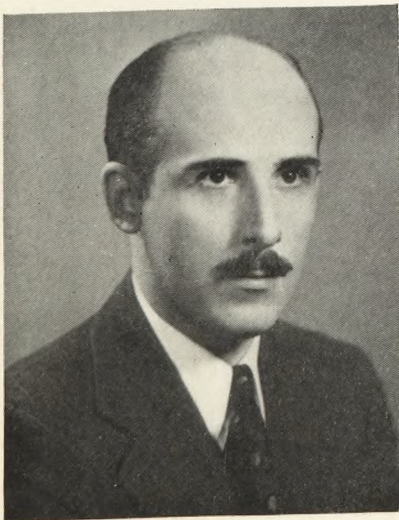
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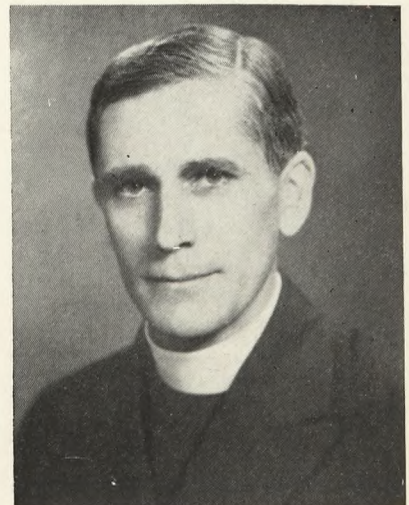
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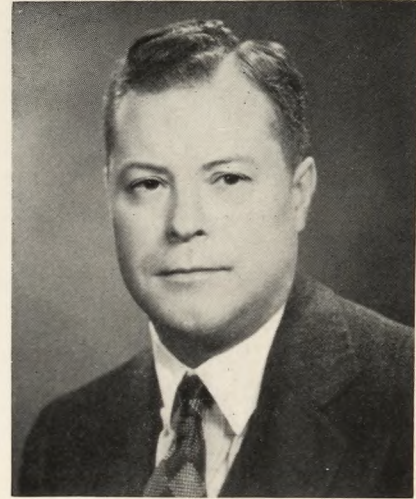


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
